

CHARNWOOD ATHLETIC CLUB SAFEGUARDING

Policy Statement

- 1. It is the policy of Charnwood Athletic Club to align with and adopt the Safeguarding and Child Protection policies and procedures of England Athletics.
- 2. Central to this approach are the following documents:
 - a. <u>Safeguarding and protecting children in athletics Policy and</u> Procedures document (1st January 2013)
 - b. <u>Safeguarding adults in athletics Policy and procedures (September 2013)</u>
 - c. Anti-bullying policy for clubs United Kingdom Athletics 2009
- 3. Charnwood Athletics Club endorses the key elements of the safeguarding policy which states that:
 - a. The welfare of the child is paramount.
 - b. All children have the right to protection from abuse
 - c. All suspicions and allegations of abuse and poor practice will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately.
 - d. All individuals involved in athletics understand and accept their responsibility to report concerns to the appropriate officer.
- 4. These principles will be implemented by the club in the following way:
 - a. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure unsuitable people are prevented from working in athletics, especially with children
 - b. All Volunteers shall complete the <u>Volunteer Application and Self</u> Declaration Form
 - c. All Coaches and Team Managers will be asked to provide a valid Enhanced level disclosure and barring service (DBS) certificate
 - d. All Coaches and Technical Officials shall be able to provide their valid UKA licence on demand
 - e. Induction training will be provided to all volunteers and coaches and shall include the club's safeguarding procedures
 - f. Coaches and Team Managers shall complete a recognised Safeguarding Training course at least once every three years
 - g. Designated Welfare Officers are nominated by the Club
- 5. The person having overall responsibility for the implementation of safeguarding procedures within the Club is the Chairperson.
